"Distractions . . . When to Say 'No' " Nehemiah 6:1-4

Sure, we can all get distracted by wasteful things . . . even bad things, but it is the good things that have the greatest potential to distract us from the best things. How can we prevent our vision from becoming derailed by distraction? How can we say "yes" to the right things? Perhaps even more importantly, how can we say "no" to the right things?

- 1. Know the enemy's strategies.
 - a. Divide and conquer.
 - b. Can't beat em? . . . join em'.
 - c. Compromise.
 - d. Distraction.
- 2. Clarify your mission.

Next Step:

- Is the Lord asking you to say "no" to something so you can focus on that which He's asked you to say yes? What is it?
- Where do you most get distracted? Write a little sign with the words of verse 3, "I have a great work to do and I cannot come down".
- Picture yourself in the future, three years from now.
