- 5. According to verse 10, "what is God's ultimate plan . . . goal?" (read also Philippians 2:9-11 and Colossians 1:19 -20)
- 6. When do you think God's plan in Christ will come to complete fulfillment? When is the 'fulness of times' (verse 10) What difference should that make for us?
- 7. What is our inheritance? (verse 11)
- 8. In what way ought these truths give us cause to hope in Christ and praise His glory? (verse 12)
