

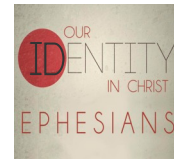

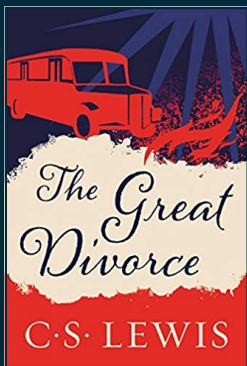

In C.S. Lewis' book *The Great Divorce*, he describes a young man who is tormented by a red lizard that sits on his shoulder constantly mocking him. The lizard is a picture of the sin that we all struggle with.

The Great Divorce is a classic Christian allegorical tale about a bus ride from hell to heaven. An extraordinary meditation upon good and evil, grace and judgment, Lewis's revolutionary idea in *The Great Divorce* is that the gates of Hell are locked from the inside. Using his extraordinary descriptive powers, Lewis' *The Great Divorce* will change the way we think about good and evil.

“Living Free In A World of Lost Understanding”

When we become a "new creation" through Christ, God blesses us with the living Holy Spirit within us to guide, impart wisdom and help us discern between God's sovereign truth, and `the world's opinionated-truth.' (1 John 4:6, NKJV)

The following are examples of those who defied the world's acquired knowledge and became witnesses and workers for God. (Acts 1:8)

Rather than live in an obscure backroom life, as an 1823 culture advised, Fanny Crosby, blinded at 6 weeks from a medical treatment, grew strong. Her humble parents grounded her in God's truth that she belonged to God, was His workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God had prepared before she was born, and He wouldn't leave her now. (Ephesians 2:10, NSAB) She attended school, married and wrote between 5,500 to 9,000 hymns!

Ann Sullivan also chose, instead of putting away her charge in an institution like those shouting their own truth . . . *"The child's blind and deaf! Put her away!"* she listened to her God- given convictions . . . "God has chosen the foolish things of the world to put to shame the wise, and the weak things of the world to put to shame the things which are mighty." (1 Corinthians 1: 27-28, NKJV) And . . . Helen Keller went to college, spoke all over the world encouraging and uplifting those living with no hope.

Then what if God said, *"Leave your wealth, and follow me,"* and ignore his colleagues arguments... *"What are you thinking? This makes no sense! You can do so much more through your monetary giving!"* That is exactly what Rick Stearns did. He stayed true to the still small voice within him believing, "Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and lean not on your own understanding, acknowledge Him, and He shall direct your paths." (Proverbs 3:5) He left his lucrative career and, for twenty years, led World Vision as CEO.

Truly the Holy Spirit, God's spokesman to believers, revealed the reality of John 8:32 to these three, and will to us, "And you shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free." No matter our station in life, great or small, may we "walk in a manner worthy of our calling" (Ephesians 4:1) and live as "ambassadors for God's Son" (2 Corinthians 5:20), exclaiming God's glory of truth to a lost world.

From Roger Mohrlang:

THE KAMWE BIBLE TRANSLATION

Wonderful news: last Saturday I completed the second major check of the entire Kamwe Old Testament. This is a task the Kamwe Bible translation team in Nigeria and I have been patiently working on for the last several years.

And what lies ahead now?

- A couple months of clean-up work on the Old Testament
- One last check of the New Testament
- detailed consistency checks
- One final careful read-through of the whole Bible to catch any remaining problems

And then, by God's grace, the entire text will be typeset and sent off to South Korea for printing—hopefully, within the next 18 months or so.

I'm grateful that my macular degeneration has progressed as slowly as it has (it's now been more than eight years since the diagnosis); with the magnification of print on the computer screen, I can still see well enough to do the work of checking and proofreading—though I have to be much more careful now. (My daughter Becky caught three typos in an earlier draft of this e-mail!)

The Kamwe area has been relatively calm after the killing and devastation caused by the jihadist Boko Haram four years ago. Most of the Kamwe community have now returned to the area to rebuild their lives and homes. However, unrest and violence continue in other parts of northern Nigeria; many, many thousands of Christians have lost their lives or been forced to flee their homes. Nigeria is now no. 12 on the Voice of the Martyrs' list of most dangerous countries in the world for Christians.

DOTTIE

This month it will be two years since the onset of my dear wife's strokes. She continues to feel the effects throughout the left side of her body and is still dependent on her wheelchair and walker (with my assistance) to get around. Her limited short-term memory and speaking ability, as well as her other limitations, sometimes discourage her and leave her wondering how she (who was so active in ministry before) can best serve Christ now—but that is still her desire.

She exercises for hours every day and works hard to learn to walk independently

again. She also works hard to recover her abilities to play the piano and work in the kitchen. And in it all, our love for each other continues to grow deeper.

As you can imagine, with Dottie's needs and the demands of the Kamwe Bible translation, there is little time for anything else. So we feel immensely blessed by all of you who have shown us so much love and practical care—getting our groceries, bringing us meals, providing transportation for Dot's therapy, taking her on outings, mowing our lawn, shoveling our snow, getting our home winterized, vacuuming the carpet, fixing things in need of repair . . . ; we cannot tell you how very grateful we are. We thank God for you, each one.

Thank you especially for praying—for Dottie and her desire to be of useful service to Christ; for me and my eyes, as I put in long hours on the Kamwe Bible translation; and for the faithful Christians working on the translation in volatile northeastern Nigeria, with the myriad problems they face.

May the blessing of Christ our Savior be upon you, dear friends, each one.
