

"A Love Unequaled" by Sharon Reidenbach

"In the beginning was the Word and the Word was with God and the Word was God ." (John 1:14, NKJV)

"In the beginning, God created the heavens and the earth." (Genesis 1:1)

In the beginning, God the Father — God the Son [the Word] and God the Holy Ghost said, "Let's make man in our image for fellowship, to live in this beautiful world. (Genesis 1:26). We'll provide all kinds of habitation, animals, flying and sea creatures, and a mate to enjoy our perfect garden. Then we'll bestow our ultimate gift, 'free-will.'

But man misused this gift and sinned. He desired equality with God and disobeyed the one command, "Do not eat from the Tree of Life." The Trinity mourned, banishing him from the garden forever.

In the beginning, through mercy, the Three-In-One chose, even then, to give man hope: "So the Lord God said to the serpent [the garden's tempter], 'And I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your seed and her Seed; He shall bruise your head, and you shall bruise His heel!" 
In the beginning however, this promise came with an unfathomable price... a sacrifice to atone the debt of sin. The one called The Son of God humbled Himself. (Isaiah 53: 2) "The Word became flesh and took up residence among us." (John 1:14) He'd experience pain, sorrow, temptation, heartache; separating Himself from His Father as heard from the cross when He died for our sins. "My God, My God why have You forsaken Me?" (Matthew 27:46)


